- Your presentation must have a title slide as its first slide.
- The number of pictures and links is not per slide, but for the entire project. It is possible that you will have a slide for which no picture is required.
- Pictures must match, or correspond, to the text they accompany. If only half your pictures are appropriate, you will get 3 points. If only a few are – five or so – you will receive 1 point.
- The overall "look" includes: Are your slides cluttered? Do you have too much text and/or bullets on each slide? Do the colors clash with each other or do they complement each other? Have you used so many different fonts and sizes that it distracts from the words you've written? Does your background or theme distract your reader from what you're trying to say?
- Mechanics includes spelling, grammar, punctuation, capitalization, and typographical errors.
- Writing style includes run-on sentences or sentence fragments, and whether or not the meaning of your writing is clear.
- Your links must relate to history, geography, society, and/or culture. Each link must be to an appropriate website, as discussed in class.
