- Each page must have a title at the top that is larger than all the other text on the page.
- For pictures per page and links per page, the rubric counts the total for the project, not for each page.
- Pictures must match, or correspond, to the text they accompany. If only half your pictures are appropriate, you will get 3 points. If only a few are – five or so – you will receive 1 point.
- The overall "look" includes: Are your pages cluttered? Do the colors clash with each other or do they complement each other? Have you used so many different fonts and sizes that it distracts from the words you've written? Are there too many distracting animations? Is the page laid out clearly so that your reader can see which picture goes with which paragraph, and follow your text easily?
- Mechanics includes spelling, grammar, punctuation, capitalization, and typographical errors.
- Writing style includes run-on sentences or sentence fragments, and whether or not the meaning of your writing is clear.
- Your links must relate to history, geography, society, and/or culture. Each link must be to an appropriate website, as discussed in class.
